As an engaged citizen actively participating in the democratic process this election year, we appeal to you for support in addressing the uneven impact that gun violence has had on communities of color. We strongly advocate for the passage of the Break the Cycle of Violence Act (S.267 H.R. 4836) and request your support in this matter. Gun violence is a pervasive issue that affects not only schools but also the broader community and tends to disproportionately impact communities of color. In 2018, gun homicide was the leading cause of death for Black men and boys aged 15-34 and the third leading cause for Latino men and boys in the same age range.

Research indicates that violence intervention programs, established in collaboration with affected communities, have the potential to significantly decrease gun violence over the long term. However, the funding for these programs remains inadequate, and as a result, they have been compelled to make significant reductions in staff, programming and outreach efforts amidst the Covid-19 pandemic.

Gun violence is complex and multifaceted, yet Congress can play a significant role in saving lives and promoting structural changes in communities by providing consistent support for evidence-based programs. I firmly endorse the Break the Cycle of Violence Act, as it provides funding for critical programs led by community members that have been proven to effectively prevent gun violence.

The detrimental effects of gun violence in our nation and state are both lamentable and financially burdensome. According to current estimates, the cost of medical and criminal justice expenses could reach billions of dollars. Firearm violence can lead to various health issues in the community, which places additional strain on already under-resourced services. Thus, it is crucial to prioritize funding for these programs, not only from a humanitarian perspective but also for the benefit of taxpayers.

As your constituent, I am asking for you to support the Break the Cycle of Violence Act (S.267 H.R. 4836) and support Congress allocating at least \$150 million annually for 10 years to community gun violence prevention and intervention programs.

The inequities in the United States are a product of systematic racism and implicit bias in our health care system. In a study by van Ryn and Burke, the National Library of Medicine reports that "Physicians viewed black patients, compared to whites, as less kind, congenial, intelligent, and educated, less likely to adhere to medical advice, and more likely to lack social support and to abuse alcohol and drugs." With assumptions like these from healthcare providers, it is no surprise that black people have the highest late-stage diagnosis and death rate for cancer, black women are three times more likely to die giving birth than white women, and Hispanic children are twice as likely to be uninsured than children of other ethnicities.

It is time to declare racism as a public health crisis. To create a more equitable and healthier future for your constituents and their children free from health care bias or inadequate treatment. I encourage you to promote efforts to amplify issues of racism and support policies that prioritize the health of all people, especially people of color.
