DEAR FRIENDS, MEMBERS & SUPPORTERS



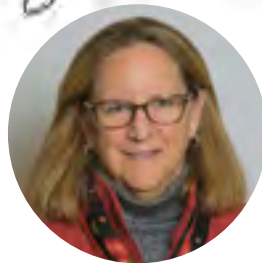

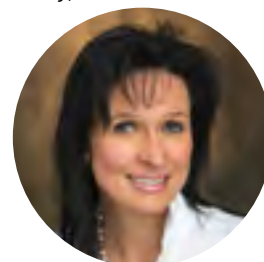

A beautiful sunny day brought over 620 runners and walkers out at YWCA Princeton's 14th annual ETS Firecracker 5K on Tuesday, June 26, 2018. The race was sponsored by more than 20 local businesses and supported by over 40 volunteers.

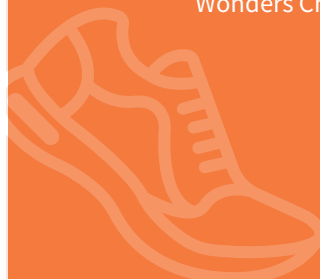

STAND AGAINST RACISM

Earlier this year, along with local partner organizations, YWCA Princeton hosted its 11th Annual Stand Against Racism campaign, popularly known as the STAND. This event was founded by YWCA Trenton and YWCA Princeton in 2007, and is now a signature campaign of YWCA USA. The STAND's purpose is to build community among those who work for racial justice and to raise awareness about the negative impact of institutional and structural racism in our communities.

The 2018 STAND began as a collaborative effort with Corner House, with a series of discussions Intergenerational Talks on Racism. On April 26, 2018, YWCA Princeton hosted **Stand Against Racism: Thought Provoking Talks**, where speakers Dr. Jianping Wang, Dr. Evelyn McDowell, Noemi de la Puente and Shirley Satterfield shared inspiring and poignant accounts of the racism they have experienced in their lives.

These shared experiences served as catalysts for group discussions that followed, which were facilitated by a panel of community partners from Not in Our Town Princeton, Central Jersey Coalition for Justice, Princeton University, Princeton Civil Rights Commission, VolunteerConnect, Kidsbridge, Hope Rises Up, Junior League of Greater Princeton and Mercer Street Friends.

On April 27, 2018, several young persons of color gathered together at Hinds Plaza to participate in the Stand Against Racism Open Mic and Youth Rally. The students sang songs and recited poetry about their experiences with racism and their hopes for the future.

Cade Brown came to YWCA Princeton’s Young Wonders Child Development Center (YWCDC) through The New Jersey Division of Youth and Family Services (DYFS), and his childcare was funded through The Child Care Connection Inc. When he was officially adopted by Tricia Brown, Tricia Brown was able to continue Cade’s childcare with YWCDC by applying for the Pearl Bates Scholarship Fund. At YWCDC, Tricia says, Cade felt safe. **“Feeling safe is really important for children in that age group, and with his background as a foster child, to reduce transition anxiety. YWCDC was a great fit from the beginning and still is.”**

Named after Pearl Nelson Bates, a dedicated community leader and enthusiastic YWCA volunteer and former Board Member, the Pearl Bates Scholarship Fund has enabled thousands of families with financial need to take advantage of the YWCA Princeton

programs and services such as the Young Wonders Child Development Center, in which Tricia’s son Cade is enrolled.

When Pearl Bates passed in 1963, her colleagues at Education Testing Service (ETS) honored her memory with a gift to the YWCA Princeton, which was to be used for youth programs. By 1965, the fund continued to grow, thanks to group and individual contributions and was formally designated the Bates Scholarship Fund.

Many others, like Tricia Brown, have used the Bates Scholarship Fund – now in its 53rd year – to enroll into programs such as the After School Program, the ESL program, Breast Cancer Resource Center services, Latinas Unidas and others.

The Benefactors for Bates cocktail party was held on Sunday, November 19, 2017 at the Chauncey Conference Center with the help of ETS and PNC Wealth Management, and helped raise funds for this crucial scholarship fund.

4TH DR. SANDRA GATT MEMORIAL GOLF TOURNAMENT

When Dr. Sandra Joy Gatt, a renowned reconstructive plastic surgeon who practiced in the Princeton area, was going through her breast cancer journey, she saw the need for a transportation and companionship program for breast cancer patients while they underwent chemotherapy. **“Even in her own suffering, she wanted to help other people,”** says Paula Flory, Director of the YWCA Princeton Breast Cancer Resource Center (BCRC).

It was her wish that no woman should be alone in her breast cancer journey, and to fulfill that wish, the Dr. Sandra Gatt Memorial Golf Tournament was born. Held every August in the memory of Dr. Gatt, the funds raised through this tournament go towards the transportation program at BCRC that matches patients with breast cancer survivor volunteers to stay with them while they are transported to and from doctor appointments.

LATINAS UNIDAS

“My daughter loves pizza, but because I did not speak English, I used to take her to a pizza place situated far from our home where I knew the staff spoke Spanish. Now I can confidently place an order for whatever my daughter wants, wherever we are,” says Epifania Ramirez, a 39-year old native of Mexico, who has been in the United States for about a decade, **“I am not intimidated anymore.”** Echoing Epifania’s sentiment is Yaharia Rodriguez, a 37-year old native of Dominican Republic, who came to the United States in 2016 along with her three children. She says she can now order her coffee however she likes it, thanks to her newly-found skills with English conversations.

For those of us who grew up speaking English, placing an order for coffee or pizza are everyday tasks. For women like Epifania and Yaharia - and the countless others who come to Latinas Unidas - learning how to take control of these commonplace interactions are big wins in their journey towards self-sufficiency and confidence.

Yaharia and Epifania are students at the Latinas Unidas’ ESL Program, and spoke no English when they came to Latinas Unidas after being referred to by their friends. They bonded over their common need for language skills, and also over the readily available option for childcare on premises, while they learned English and prepared themselves for future career opportunities with Latinas Unidas’ Job Search, Preparation and Placement Program. **“The option for childcare, the warm and welcoming atmosphere at Latinas Unidas, and the friendships I have found here make me believe that I am on the right path in my life,”** says Yaharia.

Yaharia and Epifania are just two of the many women that have walked through the doors of Latinas Unidas, which was founded more than 25 years ago as part of YWCA Trenton. Latinas Unidas has helped empower countless immigrant Latina women towards self-sufficiency through education, skills training, crisis counseling and a supportive network to assist these women in their transition to America.

In addition to the ESL Program and the Job Search, Preparation and Placement Program, Latinas Unidas also offers the EmPOWER THROUGH Program that is designed to help young adults complete their high school diploma and prepare them for the job market. Since 2016, Latinas Unidas has become a part of YWCA Princeton, but continues to offer programs and services from its location at 5 South Broad Street, Trenton.

PROGRAMS

AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM

Since 1974, the YWCA Princeton's After School Program has worked with thousands of children and families in the Lawrence and Princeton public school district to offer engagement and learning prior to and beyond regular school hours. Our goal has been to inspire and engage children in learning, provide opportunities for play and socialization, and encourage children to explore their interests, while also providing peace of mind for working parents.

Not only does the core curriculum include a multicultural program that provides a variety of interesting, social, educational, fun, physical, and creative activities that engage and stimulate children's growth, but it also includes a bullying-prevention program that fosters self-esteem and teaches children to respect themselves, others, and the environment.

YWCA Princeton's After School Program is licensed by the State of New Jersey, Department of Children and Families Office of Licensing. The After School Program is also a member of the Afterschool Alliance, NJSACC, and a participant in the annual national Lights On Afterschool celebration.

PROGRAMS

ROBOTICS

As part of its initiative to expose youth to STEM – Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics – and to spark their interest and curiosity in those fields, YWCA Princeton initiated a Robotics Program that includes outreach programs with the Princeton community, all-girls competitive Robotics teams and even a summer club for young participants!

Robotics Outreach Program

A pilot outreach program was launched with Princeton Community Village (PCV) in 2017, and enthusiastic participation called for the program to return for a second time in 2018. The outreach program was designed for children in grades 4 – 9, who are interested in STEM topics. Students were taught how to build and program LEGO NXT Robots by instructor Al Liang, a PICS (Princeton Internships in Civic Service) Intern from Princeton University. The students were also given the chance to be creative and design their own robots. Some of the robots they designed and built themselves included a breakdancing robot, battle-bots, and racing-bots!

All-Girls Competitive Robotics

As a part of an initiative hosted by Princeton University’s School of Engineering and Applied Science, and thanks to a scholarship sponsored by SES, YWCA Princeton’s formed two all-girls competitive Robotics teams – Prototype G and Robotic Rockettes. Both teams won several awards in the 2017 and the 2018 league and State Tournaments.

Summer Robotics Club

In the summer of 2018, YWCA Princeton launched its Summer Robotics Club that was open to children aged 6 to 15, and included a 360-degree immersion in STEM topics. The Club met over the course of four weeks, and each week focused on a new topic for discovery for the young participants. The topics covered were satellites, drones and rockets, science-in-a-box, and electricity.

STEM engagement programs such as those at YWCA Princeton, do more than provide access and opportunity for robotics for these young girls - they also help shape their self-confidence, mastery over complex concepts and empower them to reach out to their peers to cultivate similar passions as theirs.

YOUNG WONDERS CHILD DEVELOPMENT CENTER (YWCDC)

Located in Princeton and Hamilton, YWCA Princeton's YWCDC offers a dynamic and multicultural setting for well-rounded learning led by caring, experienced educators. The child development center utilizes The Creative Curriculum®, an award-winning, research-based curriculum that not only enables children to develop their confidence, creativity and critical thinking skills, but also emphasizes exploration and discovery as a way of learning.

With a rich history spanning over 45 years at Hamilton and over 30 years at Princeton, YWCDC is known for providing a warm and welcoming family environment for children from all socio-economic strata that come to the YWCA Princeton.

Shrouk Alyan and her husband migrated to United States from Egypt, in early 2017 with their two young daughters – 4-year-old Hala and 3-year old Farah. **“I came to the United States so I could give my daughters a better life, and a better education,”** recalls Shrouk. They were referred to the Princeton YWCDC by a volunteer at the ESL program.

Soon after they joined, Shrouk says her timid and reserved daughters have blossomed into confident young girls. Shrouk says, **“Hala is totally different today – she used to be afraid of making friends and would often cry because she didn't have anyone to play with, but now, she has many friends!”**

The Hamilton YWCDC – originally a program with the YWCA Trenton – was established in 1972 as a way to address the emerging need for a preschoolers program that could provide children a stimulating group environment where they could play and learn. Over the years, Hamilton YWCDC added all-day classes as well as before and after school care where working parents could have a safe environment to leave their children in.

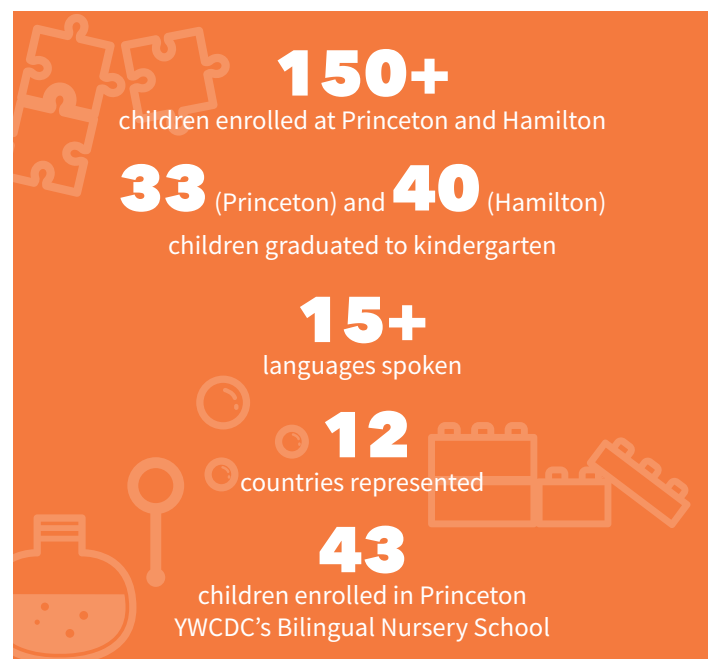

PROGRAMS

LITERACY PROGRAMS - ESL & HiSET

Güler Kalkan moved to the United States in 2017, with her husband and two children, as a political asylee from Turkey. Fleeing fraught military conditions in their homeland, Güler and her family has now made Plainsboro, New Jersey their home. Soon after they moved here, Güler was encouraged by friends to enroll into the YWCA Princeton Literacy Program's ESL classes.

"I attended the Level 3 and Advanced Conversation ESL classes, which helped me improve my skills with spoken and written English," says Güler. When Güler was unable to attend further classes because of financial reasons, and also to stay home to look after her young daughters, she was referred to the Young Wonders Child Development Center where she is now employed as an assistant child development teacher.

Students in the YWCA Princeton's ESL program excel because of its focus on small group instruction and wealth of immersion opportunities outside of class. Drop-in conversations, one-on-one and small group practice sessions occur daily. Workshops ranging from everyday survival to job search skills, and strong partnerships with other local organizations, help students integrate into community life.

Literacy Programs at YWCA Princeton not only cater to those like Güler, but also offer free High School Equivalency preparation classes that equip students to pass the New Jersey High School Diploma exam. **"It is wonderful to see students of all ages, and who come from all walks of life, be motivated to learn and get their GED through these programs,"** says Barbara Reisner who teaches reading and writing at the YWCA Princeton for the last 4 years, and who taught elementary and middle school students for 32 years.

Testing is conveniently arranged at YWCA's on-site HiSET® Testing Center. Free citizenship preparation classes give students the information and self-confidence for their naturalization interview.

Members of the Newcomers and Friends group come from all over the community including Montgomery, West Windsor, Plainsboro, Lawrenceville, Cranbury, Hillsborough, Hopewell, Pennington and Monroe.

The Newcomers and Friends group hosts monthly Friday with Friends meetups where acclaimed speakers from business, political, civic and educational circles are invited. At Social Coffees, group members meet and greet friends while enjoying refreshments and coffee. Interest Groups – catering to various interests such as reading, hiking, movies, wines and much more – are a great way to meet women that share a common interest and get involved with the group.

Besides meeting other newcomers to the Princeton area and making new friends, the Newcomers and Friends group has also been a source of support for members undergoing difficult times. When some members were ill, or undergoing medical treatments, other members would send them cards of cheer, offer rides or meals, and keep them company while they went to doctor appointments.

“This group especially enjoys giving back to the YWCA Princeton community – the Newcomers and Friends group has been supporting the children’s programs with gifts around the holiday season as well as donations for supplies to teachers, for a few years now and it is truly one of the highlights of the year for us;” says Betty Dominick, President of the Newcomers and Friends.

PLAINSBORO AQUATICS

YWCA Princeton’s Plainsboro Aquatics program turned 20 in June 2018!

In June 1998, the YWCA Princeton was asked by the Plainsboro Recreation Department to partner with them, and help educate and teach their community residents the importance of safety, comfort, ability and benefits of being in the water all year round. The program that started with 90 participants in 1998, has now served over 10,000 residents that include infants, preschoolers, school age children, teenagers and adults.

The program is specially designed for people of all ages and abilities, and classes allow swimmers to not only develop skills to become stronger and safer swimmers, but also improve their confidence and self-esteem in a fun, friendly and safe environment. One of the program participants, who now works as a swim instructor says, **“Working at the pool is one of the reasons I’ve become more confident—and just changed a lot in general. I really enjoy the challenge of teaching and trying to get students to understand something. Seeing my students progress and learn a valuable life skill is very rewarding.”**



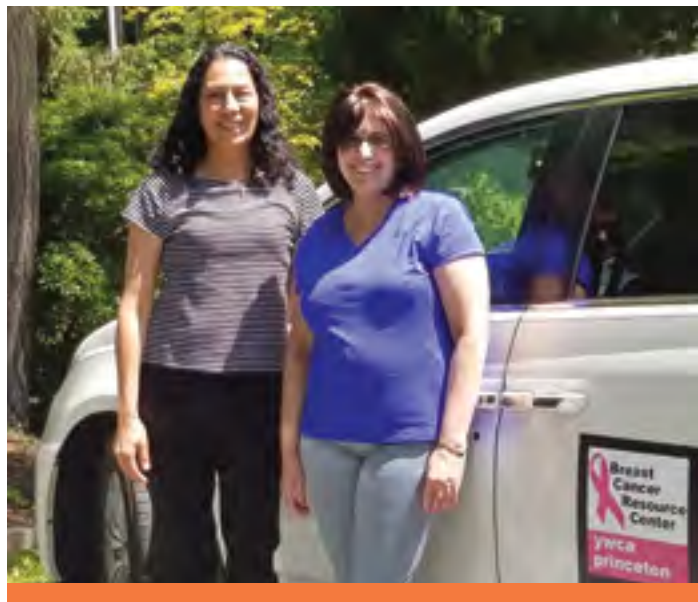
PROGRAMS

BREAST CANCER RESOURCE CENTER

In 1972, Helen G. Kohut, a dance instructor at the YWCA Princeton, realized that physical activities in warm water were beneficial for women recovering from mastectomy operations, and so, she developed a weekly aquatics program called ENCORE for postoperative breast cancer survivors. Over the next few years, the program was adopted by YWCA USA as one of its national programs, and Helen traveled to other YWCA's in the United States to provide training and instruction.

The ENCORE program was subsequently renamed Breast Cancer Resource Center (BCRC) and grew from catering to a group of 5 survivors, to serving thousands of cancer patients and survivors, and their families each year through a host of programs that are free of charge.

Today, BCRC remains dedicated to providing support and information to women and their families with a firm belief that no one should have to face breast cancer alone. They accomplish this through extensive community outreach and education, fitness and wellness programs, support group sessions, transportation programs to accompany those undergoing treatment, fittings for wigs, prosthesis and bras, and educational workshops.

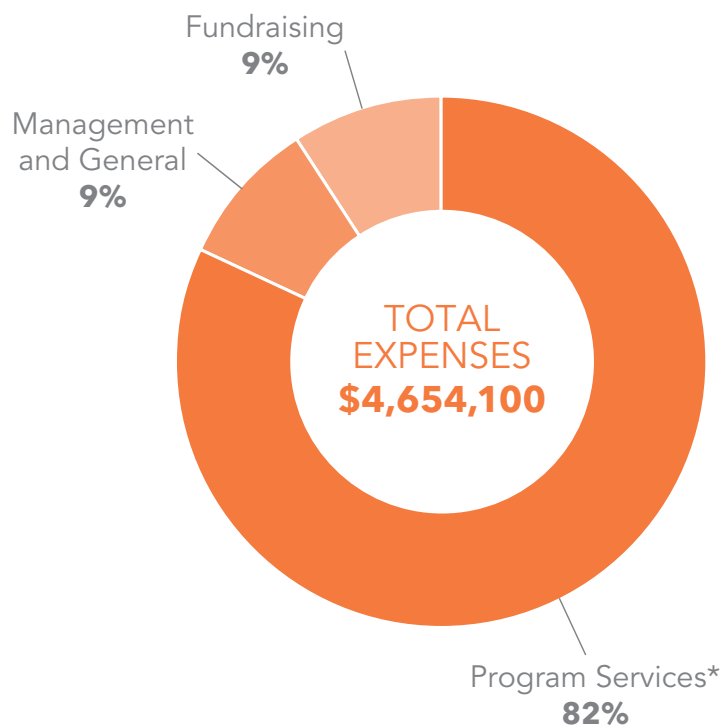
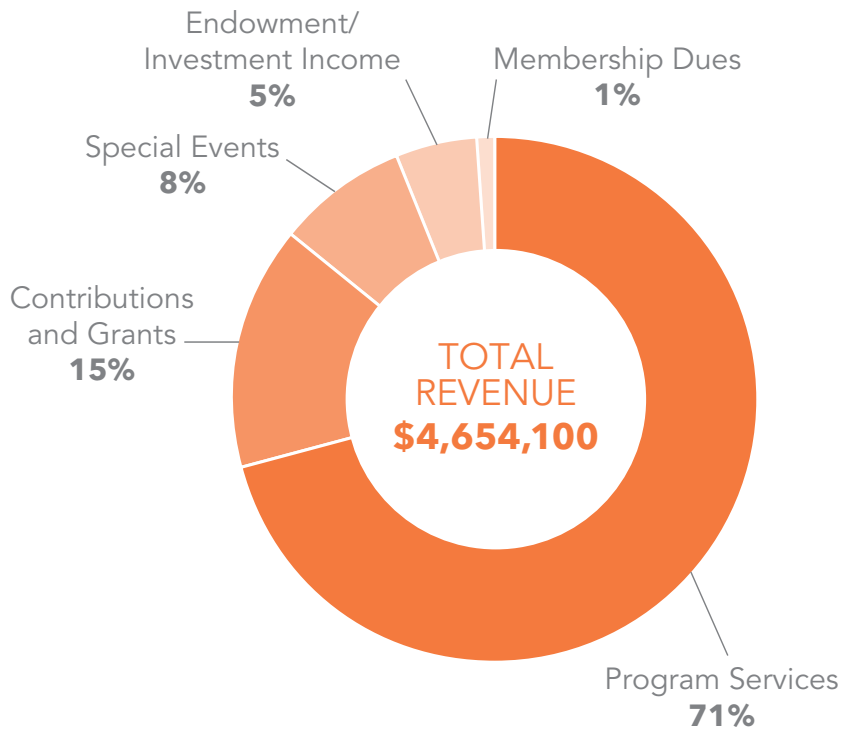
