Co-founders of CHOOSE and Princeton High School alumnae, Winona and Priya share details of their journey toward becoming racially literate, together. There is a proverb that says if you want to get somewhere fast, go alone but if you want to get somewhere far (and I will add safely), go together. Describing the socioemotional work required to develop racial literacy (socioemotional intellect), both talks describe pitfalls and victories of exploring race and privilege from their perspectives as radical listeners to each other, random others and themselves.

Howard Stevenson: Dealing with Racially Stressful Encounters

In this TED Talk, Stevenson describes the importance of intergenerational racial storytelling in dealing with racially stressful encounters.
