Services provided by Zufall Health Center - Plainsboro include:

- Well care and preventative care
- Sick care and acute care visits
- Emergency Department follow-up visits
- Pediatric, adult medical, OB/GYN, and other specialty clinics
- Referrals for outpatient diagnostics, imaging, laboratory and additional support services
- Ongoing care for chronic conditions such as management of asthma, weight issues and diabetes
- Mental health services, including individual psychotherapy, family therapy, addiction counseling and case management
- Nutrition services including counseling, weight management for obesity, and parent/child education
- Prescription Assistance Program that can help provide medications at little or no cost to eligible patients
- Vaccines for Children Program - immunizations from the state are available year-round at no cost to eligible patients
- Podiatry

Free Health Services

The town of Princeton and Mercer County have free or low-cost care options for uninsured and underinsured eligible individuals, regardless of immigration status. There are services available for both children and adults.



The Zufall Health Center - Plainsboro provides free or low-cost care to uninsured and underinsured eligible individuals living in Mercer and Middlesex Counties. Services may be provided free of charge to those who qualify for the New Jersey Hospital Care Payment Assistance Program (Charity Care Assistance). Other individuals may be eligible for Medicare, Medicaid, or Medicaid Managed Care.
